

Disappointing exam results for borough schools

The published league tables for last summer's exams showed



that over half of our secondary schools in Waltham Forest were below the national average of 57.1 per cent whereas all the secondary schools in Redbridge were all above the national average.

Focus says, The Council needs to address why our schools lag behind most schools in England and particularly why nearby Redbridge out performs Waltham Forest.


